HOA President's Remarks

Since we last reported on home sales in the Meadows at Shawnee (MAS) community, we have seen home mortgage interest rates rise and the pace of home sales in MAS has somewhat slowed, but sales remain relatively strong as most home values are holding.

Rising costs have impacted our HOA budget in all areas of its operation. We have seen increased prices for insurance coverage, grounds and pond maintenance, administrative services, postage and supplies. Even with these substantial cost pressures our finances remain strong and we fully anticipate finishing the current fiscal year within budget. Our Association's Treasurer, Dan Marabello, presents a summary status review in his report.

Increased costs also forced a modification to plans for the front entrance renovation as addressed by the Grounds Committee Chairperson, Taylor Shunk. Taylor also gives a review of the retention ponds and clarifies the use of common grounds by its members. The Architectural Review and Neighborhood Watch Committees actions are reported by their Chairpersons, Tom Chilton and Dave Markowitz, respectively.

MEADOWS AT SHAWNEE 2022 HOME SALES

In calendar year 2022, there were thirteen (13) homes that sold in the development and so far in 2023, three (3) more homes have been sold. Over the past few years, the values of the homes in the development have steadily increased and the selling prices during 2022 ranged from \$290,000 to \$441,000. Most homes sold very quickly this past year and that could be attributed to a home's curb appeal and the generally well-kept appearance of our development.

On that note, the Board is appealing to homeowners to please maintain your home's overall appearance by adhering to a few restrictions and other suggestions as follows:

- Keep all trash receptacles hidden from street view;
- Do not park cars on the lawn;
- Keep lawns neatly mowed and no grass clippings in the street;
- Do not store wood, garden supplies, toys or other clutter in the front or side of your home;
- And most importantly, remove the green algae from the vinyl siding on your home once it appears.

Please be considerate of your neighbors and do your part to keep your home in a neat condition for the sake of your home's value and the benefit of the whole community. Thank you for your cooperation.

Planning to add a deck, fence, or a shed to your lot? Before you do, check the HOA's Declaration of Restrictions to ensure that your plan will comply with HOA guidelines so your project will not be held up.

Download the Architectural Review Form at: www.meadowsatshawnee.com, select Committees, select Architectural, then Architectural Request. All the information is there to complete the process.

PRIVACY FENCE MAINTENANCE

For those of you who have a privacy fence facing Rehoboth Boulevard or Kirby Road, it is your responsibility to keep the fence free of mold, mildew and algae, etc. If algae needs to be removed, I recommend spraying the area of the fence with *Spray & Forget*. The product can be bought pre-mixed or it can be mixed with water and sprayed on with a hand-held sprayer. I have had great success by spraying this on my house as well. Available at hardware stores or on Amazon.

Grounds Committee



All of our new plants from last year have survived due in large to the mulch we applied last fall. This was undertaken by MAS volunteers. Without continued volunteer support,

this cannot be sustained. Our long-term solution to maintaining the landscaping would be by contracting a landscaping company, an expensive alternative.

Our plan for the front entrance was modified due to higher costs. We plan to scale back and install a weed barrier, rocks (instead of mulch) and metal and stone edging. We hope this will eliminate the need for a costly irrigation system. However, we still need your help. Feel free to weed the front entrance or contact Taylor Shunk if you need assistance.

The retention ponds are still looking great. But we need your help here to keep our ponds clean. If you see litter, please pick it up.

Yard waste or grass clippings dumped into or near the ponds will cause algae growth costing the HOA money for remediation. This is a violation of Delaware's Department of Natural Resources and Environmental Control (DNREC) regulations which could lead to stiff fines for the offending party.

Sussex County Senior Citizen Property Tax Credit

Homeowners age 65 or over are eligible for a tax credit on their regular school property taxes of 50% (up to \$500). This credit can only be used for your primary residence. Eligibility requirements must be met.

Deadline for filing is April 30th. For information, visit the Department of Finance's website at:

Milford's Senior Citizen Tax Exemption

Property owners age 65 or older may be eligible for a reduction on Milford property taxes. A sole property owner may qualify if their income is not in excess of

\$20,000 per year, or in the case of jointly owned property, their combined income does not exceed \$40,000 per year. Qualifications and some exclusions may apply.

Eligible owners must apply by June 1st. To find out if qualify. check details on http://cityofmilford.com/ search for Tax Relief for Senior Citizens.
