Milford School District News

The current population of Milford is approaching eleven thousand (11,000) inhabitants. Additionally, the city has granted final approval for a thousand new housing units to be constructed scheduled to start in 2018 or early 2019.

The Milford School District is anticipating a critical need for more classroom space in a few years to accommodate this growing population. But, before the District can move forward it realizes that the status of the old Lakeview Avenue middle school facility must first be addressed. To this end, the District invited a group of diverse interested residents to form the Milford Middle School Committee to seek community ideas. The Committee held the first of many planned open community forums on August 27th seeking

citizen/resident ideas on the site's future. The next meeting is scheduled for September 25th at 6 PM in the Milford Central Academy cafeteria.

(Reorganization Meeting)

Meetings are held at 7 PM in the multimedia room located on the west side of the former Milford Middle School main building located at 612 Lakeview Avenue, Milford, DE.

Senior Citizen Tax Exemption

Homeowners age 65 or over are eligible for a tax credit against regular school property taxes of 50 percent (up to \$400). This credit may only be used against property taxes on a primary residence.

Individuals who establish legal domicile in Delaware on or after January 1, 2018 will be required to have been legally domiciled within the State for a period of at least 10 consecutive years in order to be eligible to receive a credit. Individuals who establish legal domicile in Delaware AFTER December 31, 2012, but prior to January 1, 2018 will continue to be required to have been legally domiciled within the State for a period of at least 3 consecutive years in order to be eligible to receive a credit. Individuals who have established domicile in Delaware prior to January 1, 2013, will be eligible to receive the credit in the ensuing tax year.

The application deadline for filing is no later than April 30. Please visit the Department of Finance's website at www.finance.delaware.gov for additional information and the application form or call the Sussex County Dept. of Finance at 302-855-7824.

The **City of Milford** also offers senior citizens a reduced rate on their annual property tax bill. Property owners must meet <u>income qualifications</u> and apply by June 1 of the current tax year. Details are available on line at:

Dog Waste



Contrary to popular belief, dog feces is not fertilizer and does not provide any benefit to the soil. The EPA has labeled dog waste as a non-source environmental pollutant thereby placing

it in the same category as herbicides and insecticides, oil, grease and toxic chemicals much like the acid drainage from infected mines.

A single gram of waste can contain up to 23 million fecal coliform bacteria which can cause cramps, diarrhea, intestinal illness and serious kidney disorders in humans. Moreover, fecal coliform bacteria runoff from dog waste can polute the local water table (see: www.epa.gov).

Please remember to curb and clean up after your pet in all common areas and streets in the development (including Kirby Road) for a cleaner and healthier neighborhood.

Appearance Matters!!

One of the goals for each of us should be to help keep the Meadows at Shawnee looking as attractive as possible. If you take a drive through other housing communities in Milford it would soon become apparent how much nicer our community is when compared to the others. The Meadows at Shawnee projects an unmistakable appeal as a community with a friendly atmosphere that takes pride in its appearance.

The most apparent comparisons are: (1) The lack of trees in other communities vs. ours where homeowners have planted trees that are beginning to mature; (2) a laxed maintenance of houses and lots is conspicuous in other communities; and (3) how other communities have deviated from cohesive design schemes compromising their overall visual appearance that potentially affects neighborhood values.

As Meadows at Shawnee homeowners and residents, we need to each do our part. Simple things like: properly storing trash, recyclable and yard waste cans and removing them from the driveway the same day they are collected; picking up toys, other "stuff" and debris, and not leave them lying about for days on end; and, keeping lawns mowed at least twice each month from March through November (Article VI, Section 12, "Lawn Mowing" of the Restrictions). Or, more involved things such as removing algae/mold from siding, and taking care of landscaping.

Houses have been selling at a good pace recently and prices are beginning to increase as our neighborhood is becoming more desirable to people moving into town. Don't be known as *that house* on the block that detracts from the appearance of other houses on the block.

Maintaining the Meadows at Shawnee as the premier community benefits everyone. Remember, we are all in this together.

"Take Out The Papers And The Trash"

Twice each year the City of Milford mails out 6-month calendars with the monthly utility bill to all homeowners covering the solid waste schedule for the following 12 months. The Meadows at Shawnee development is part of **Route 4.** Our normally scheduled pick-up days are: Weekly trash and recyclable pickup is every **Friday**; and, yard waste – every **Monday**.

For information on the 2018 – 2019 Solid Waste Schedule, bulk service or brush collection, please call the City of Milford Customer Service at **422-6616** or visit the website: www.cityofmilford.com for additional information.

To dispose of alternative or excess waste like: Residential solid waste; White Goods – (items such as refrigerators, air conditioners, and other appliances); Tires – (No more than 4 passenger-size tires per load at all transfer stations); and, Household Yard Waste – how residents can dispose of grass, leaves, branches, and shrubs, please contact the Milford Transfer Station located at 1170 S. Trash Receptacles

As a reminder, all residents are required to properly store all trash, yard waste or recycling receptacles in accordance with *Article VI*, *Section 6* of the Declaration of

Restrictions as follows: "Trash receptacles shall be kept in clean, sanitary and enclosed areas, hidden from view, excepting that they may be placed temporarily at street side on the regular day of collection if required by the collection agency."

Overnight Street Parking

From its start the Meadows at Shawnee HOA has had a restriction on overnight street parking. Article VI, Section 7 of the HOA's Declaration of Restrictions entitled "Prohibited Vehicles" states in part as follows: "...All motor vehicles owned and operated by residents of the subdivision must be parked overnight in their respective garage or driveway."

This is also a safety measure to ensure that emergency vehicles can navigate the streets and safely be deployed if needed. Please comply for everyone's sake.



Political Signs

As the 2018 November 6th General Election nears, campaign signs will

begin to appear, remember, in Article VI, Section 8, "Signs" in the Restrictions that "A maximum number of two (2) Political Signs, no larger than 18" X 24" are permitted to be placed on each lot 30 days (October 7th) prior to an election and must be removed within 48 hours after."



Volunteers Needed!!

There is a deep and continuing area of concern for the Board of Directors, and that is the need for more community involvement by

volunteering to help with HOA activities. The HOA's ability to expand its outreach, conduct semi-annual cleanups and develop other community activities depends on volunteer help.

There is especially a need for younger HOA members to become involved and volunteer to provide a more rounded and inclusive view of the community's needs in order to keep the HOA active, engaged and relevant. We have always relied upon its member volunteers to help with activities and consequently keep expenses in check and the annual assessment low. Get involved! It's your neoghborhood and HOA.



Neighborhood Watch

The Neighborhood Watch is always looking for more volunteers to help keep Meadows at Shawnee safe.

Neighborhood Watch volunteers patrol throughout the

Grounds Committee

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On Saturday, September 8th the first 4 of

6 trees were planted on the elevated ground near the large pond. The two remaining trees will be planted within the next 30 days. The cost for the trees and plantings was offset through an in-kind grant from the Delaware Forest Service's Urban and Community Forestry Project.

Pond clean-out will take place in two phases; the first will be the removal of the "volunteer" trees that are growing in the ponds. The second phase will be the removal of the plants/weeds growing in the ponds in late fall after the growing season. In both cases, the maintenance requires the ponds be dry to get the required equipment in to do the removals.



Architectural Committee

The Architectural Request Form must be submitted when requesting approval for a project such as: installing solar panels, a fence, patio, shed, etc. The form can be

filled out on line and is found under the Committees, Architectural Tab, at: www.meadowsatshawnee.com. When assembling your request packet, be sure to include a sketch of the project on your plat (survey) map, indicate where the object of the request is to be located and its dimensions (so your contractor will know what they will be dealing with). It is also advisable to talk to your neighbors informing them of what you are planning.

Brown/Discolored Water

If you experience brown or discolored water the Milford Water Department recommends that you open a faucet and run water for about 20 minutes to flush the system. If that doesn't work call the Water Department at: 302-422-1110. If no one answers leave a detailed message with your name, address, and the date and time of the problem. Each time someone in the Meadows at Shawnee has called, the Water Department has responded and, in most

instances, visited the homeowner.

Are You Prepared? Plan Ahead for Disasters

Hurricane Season is upon us and winter storms will soon follow. Are you prepared to survive heavy rains, flooding and wind or heavy snow, extreme cold and wind? The Sussex County Emergency Operations Center advises that residents should prepare by taking the following precautions: Have food, water and medications for each person in the house for 7 days; Be ready for power and phone outages; Keep mobile phones charged; Refill your gas tank(s) and stock your vehicle with emergency supplies and a change of clothes; Bring outside furniture and garbage cans inside; Have cash on hand to last 7 days. Buying and Keeping a Fresh Christmas Tree Safe

As the holiday season approaches, for many of us that means buying a fresh cut Christmas tree. Here are some simple steps to take when buying,

bringing home, putting up and decorating your tree.

How do I know if the tree is fresh? There are several things to do to determine if it's fresh: Grab the tree and bang the bottom on the ground a few times; Run a gloved hand across the branches toward you; and, squeeze some needles between two fingers. If a great number of needles fall off when you bang the bottom of the tree or, if your gloved hand does not come out clean or, if the needles snap when you squeeze them between your fingers don't buy that tree.

When you get a tree home. Once your tree is home, acclimate it before bringing it inside your house. Put your tree in an unheated area – such as a garage, basement, or even an enclosed porch – for one to three days. When you are ready to bring it inside, cut off a section of the tree's trunk between ½ and 1 inch immediately prior to putting the tree in the stand. This cut is important because dried tree sap forms a seal over the tree's stump within a few hours after being cut down forming a seal that limits the amount of water the tree can absorb.

Once in the tree stand. Fill the tree stand with

water, a fresh tree can absorb as much as a gallon of water in the first 24 hours after it's cut and more than a quart every day after that.

Where to place your tree. Keep trees away from all heat sources (stoves, fireplaces and heat vents) and it should be kept out of the flow of traffic.

Decorating your tree. When decorating, use only UL-approved lighting and electrical cords.

Disposing of the tree. Never burn the tree in a fireplace or stove! Check for scheduled city tree pickups or, try turning your tree into mulch. Whatever you decide to do with your tree, please be sure to recycle or dispose of it properly and safely.
